


Septic Suitability

- Septic limitation data are derived using soils data. Soil boundaries were digitized from 1:20,000 orthophotos for the Windham County Soil Survey. Septic limitation classifications were created by NRCS and reflect the most current (1996) Vermont standards.

Important note: Proposed changes to Vermont's on-site septic system regulations, which may take place in 2002, would render these septic suitability ratings obsolete.

Notes:
- On-site investigation is required to verify the existence and extent of the soils data shown on this map.
- This map should be used for planning purposes and general reference only.

The Septic Suitability classes describe soil conditions in terms of the type of septic system that could normally be installed. Classes 1 and 2 can be considered good, suitable for siting conventional systems; Classes 3 and 4 as fair, requiring mound systems; and 5 and 6 as poor or unsuitable. Areas not rated have little or no identifiable soil material.

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
