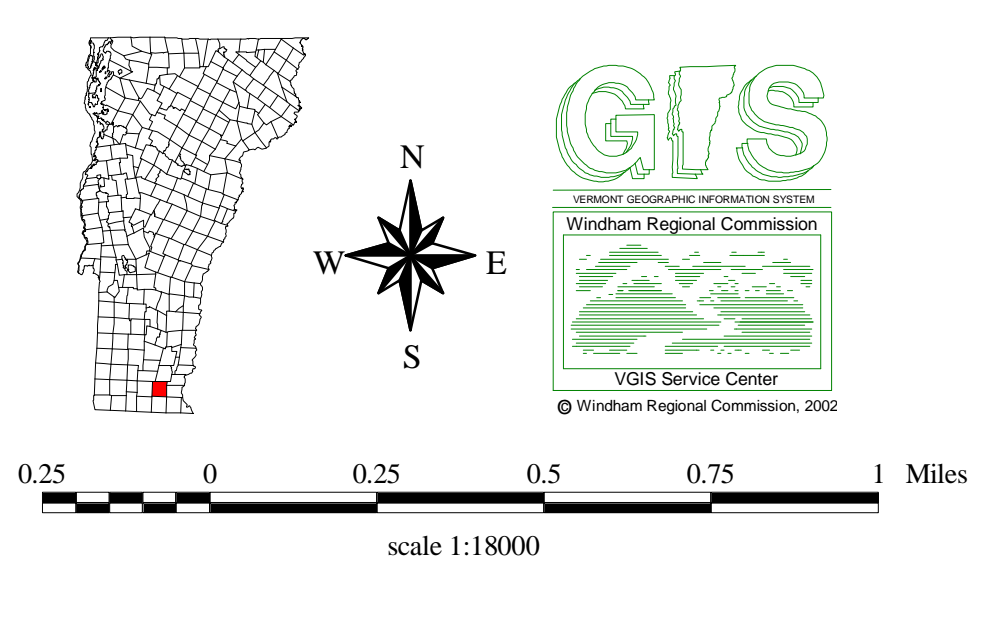


Water Related Resources Town of Marlboro, Vermont



- Flood hazard area

Sources:

- Wetlands are from US Fish and Wildlife Service's National Wetlands Inventory (NWI) maps. These maps show approximate locations of wetlands that are generally 3 acres or larger in size.
- Surface waters were digitized from 1974 1:5000 orthophotos by the University of Vermont's School of Natural Resources under contract with VGIS (VGIS data layer SWmmn). The data have been attributed and have received limited editing by WRC. The classification of streams as perennial or intermittent is taken from USGS topographic maps.
- The delineated portion of the Sunset Lake Watershed contributes to Brattleboro's public community water system. It is classified as a Surface Water Source Protection Area by the Vermont Agency of Natural Resources. Boundary data are from VT ANR Water Supply Division digital data.
- Flood hazard areas were approximated from FEMA maps. These boundaries should not be used as a replacement for the official maps.
- Shorelands are those areas within 300 feet of a major water body.

Notes:

- On-site investigation is required to verify the existence and extent of the wetlands data shown on this map.
- This map should be used for planning purposes and general reference only.
